Memorial Weekend – We will be remembering World War I in our weekend exhibit; the U.S. entered this war 100 years ago. Our FACEBOOK posts are currently highlighting Fairview veterans of this war. Open hours are Sunday, Noon to 4 p.m. and Monday (Memorial Day), 10:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. And, as in the past, members of the French Creek Living History Association will set up their own exhibit outside during this weekend. Our Board's Member-at-Large, Jim Bolla, Sr., has spearheaded this activity for many years. As always, the Chapel will be open for an hour after the ceremonies conclude at the Cemetery.

Our own World War I exhibit also will be available for view during these two June weekends. Hours are: Saturday (6/24) – 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. and Sunday (6/25) – Noon to 4 p.m.

BOARD ELECTIONS

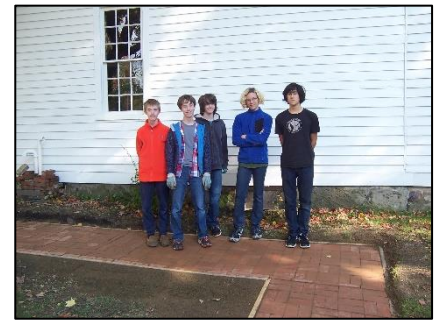
Due to the weather, elections were not held until our April Meeting. Elected to two-year terms were Kay Lynne Picheco, Carole Hanna and James Bolla Sr.
